Project Update

Hello Everyone!

I know it has been some time since you received an update about the [risk assessment tool project](#). For those who may not know, the American College of Preventive Medicine is working with the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) to further develop its childhood injury risk assessment tool for home visitation programs into a mobile application.

Thank you to all **353 individuals** from home visitation programs who completed the survey! As a result, we found that there are a diverse array of models used by home visitation programs; receiving information on 45 different models. Also, we learned it is incredibly important to have a mobile tool that staff can access when in homes without internet access. As a result of our data collection, we hope to continue this project in two phases, provided funding is available:


Phase 1: Pilot-test mobile website that emails results to selected recipient in PDF and Excel format. *Must have internet/data access in home.*

Phase 2: Develop and pilot-test a mobile website with login credentials, will be compatible with CCD requirements so information can be sent directly to an Electronic Health Record (EHR) in addition to PDF and Excel formats, and the form can be completed and saved in homes without internet access. *Provided funding is available.*
