Meet our Speakers

Janet Bailey, DVM, DACVIM

Dr. Janet Bailey is the daughter of a mixed practice veterinarian and came to veterinary medicine after raising her two daughters. She received her veterinary medical degree from Kansas State University in 2002. Following a one year internship program at VCA South Shore Animal Hospital in Massachusetts, Dr. Bailey continued her training with a residency in small animal internal medicine at Louisiana State University. Peter Bondy, DVM, DACVIM
