# Six Quality Outcomes: Planning Backwards from the End of Year-1



- Qualified and Competent School Leadership: Leader has instilled confidence from teachers, parents, board and students and has effectively begun to implement many components of school proposal.
- Sound Operational Practices: Foundations for strong fiscal management and effective business operations have been established and are being adhered to.
- Functional Governing Board: Board has obtained initial training, is committed to ongoing training, and adheres to state statutes and board policies with fidelity.
- Effective Academics & Instruction: Curriculum is being effectively implemented and instructional staff engages students for optimal learning.
- Robust Performance Management Plan: Data from a Data Management System and Interim Assessments are being used effectively to guide instruction.
- Clear, Mission-Driven School Culture: A strong, mission-driven culture has been established and can be easily observed throughout most aspects of the school.

The League believes that these Quality Outcomes are critical to have in place at the end of your school's first year and, as such, we provide targeted supports at each stage of development to help accomplish this.



### **Targeted Supports from the League**

# Targeted Supports in Year-0 (Post Application Approval through Opening):

- Opening checklist, purchasing calendars, sample contract language, etc.
- Access to the League's online charter school job board.
- Listing your school in the charter directory on the League's website.
- · Calendar of critical trainings and events.
- · Brokering connections and collaborations.
- · Face to face meetings as needed
- \*Onboarding Your New Charter School- A League Training for Newly Approved Schools:
  - Designed to assist newly (and nearly) approved schools in navigating through the complexities of year-0

- Presents a clear path forward to effectively transition your charter application from the theoretical proposal that it currently is into a viable organization. Schools will identify next steps and gain the tools, resources and the understanding necessary to successfully open and operate their school.

# Targeted Supports in Year-1 (Opening Through End of First Year of Operation):

- Connection point to other League staff/departments.
- Document reviews: board agendas and minutes, financial transparency posts, etc.
- Model documents.
- Calendar of critical trainings and events: governance, finance, MSST, data teams, UIP, SPF, assessments, etc.
- Critical connections: administrator, board and business manager cohorts, etc.
- · Readiness checklist review (see survey below).
- \*\*Year-1 Spring Visit--The Culmination of the League's Targeted New School Supports: At the end of year-1, League staff will schedule a visit to your school to conduct a friendly review of critical documents, observe classes and meet with school leadership, teachers, parents, students and board members. Verbal and written feedback will be provided following the visit. For recipients of the CSP grant, this visit will help prepare for the required site visit (if in year 2 of the grant) or the extensive <u>CSSI</u> visit in the following year. The League's year-one spring visit was developed to closely align with the <u>CSSI</u> visit which was created to ensure that schools set a course for self-improvement in the early years. The year-one spring visit is a valuable process to undergo whether or not you are a CSP grant recipient.
- <u>The "I Don't Have Time For This Survey" survey</u> for Year-1 Schools:

We know that you are busy, but this survey is actually your friend! This is where we ask you to trust us. Many schools in their first year miss some of the critical pieces that are addressed herein and this is our way of making sure they are on your radar. Also, the answers to this survey will help inform our spring visit and prepare you for the CSSI visit. Please make sure that a Head of School (or Academic Leader), Business Manager and Board President completes this survey. We definitely want the input from folks who are serving in each of these positions. Each school that fills out the survey will have access to their individual report of the survey findings and can use that as a tool to keep track of their progress.

\*Information about the Onboarding Your Charter School training will be announced soon for schools approved to open in 2017.

\*\* Year-1 spring visits are, of course, voluntary but are strongly recommended and we will reach out to schools in February to set them up.

**Description:** Are your students with specific learning disabilities in reading still not closing the gap after the third cycle of the Wilson Reading System? Far too often, students placed in special education for reading disabilities are simply pushed through a research-based scope and sequence such as the Wilson Reading System which rarely yield dramatic student gains. This is because 1) research-based programming is not a "one size fits all" remedy for reading deficiencies, and 2) the magic is in the implementation, not the box set. Special Education teachers must adeptly diagnose root cause gaps in skills and knowledge, and specially design curriculum and instruction to address these personalized needs- and they must do it efficiently. Participants will understand the different cognitive processing of reading, and will be able to improve student growth by implementing a continuous instructional inquiry cycle:

- Teachers collect various screeners that assess the different processing of reading.
- Teachers plot and analyze screening data to determine root cause gaps.
- Teachers triangulate data with other assessment and observational sources.
- Teachers prioritize instruction through a problem solving process.
- Teachers implement prioritized instruction and progress monitor goals/objectives.

Teachers review progress monitoring and adjust groupings and instructional plans. In addition to gaining a deeper understanding of reading processes and building a stronger skill set in data-driven instruction, participants will learn instructional best practices and evidence-based programming options for specialized instruction in reading and writing.
