What is EPFP?

The Education Policy Fellowship Program (EPFP) is a nine-month professional development program that provides emerging leaders with the knowledge and networks to impact a broad range of education and public policy issues.

Fellows concentrate on three program strands:

- Policy
- Leadership
- Networking

Fellows discuss and apply new insights and build and develop new skills.



Apply to become an EPFP Fellow if you have:

- A passion for education policy and a desire to improve opportunities for children, youth, and adults
- A commitment to personal and professional development
- A full-time, professional position with substantive work experience
- A minimum of a bachelor's degree or its equivalent
- The endorsement of your employer
- The financial support of your employing organization or the ability to self-fund (program fee of \$3,750; discounted rate of \$3,250 before June 1)
