Advanced Supervisory Liability supplements the Basic Supervisory Liability online training program. This program will work towards ensuring effective and constitutional policing through the training of proper supervision standards. These standards will review the current legal standards, case law interpretation and common police practices. This class requires four to six hours per week for four weeks which can be completed at any time to fit your schedule.

Module One:

Supervision Pursuant to Proper Police Practices

This topic area will review the applicable standards identified through interpretation of Monell Liability and standards pursuant to Section 42 U.S.C. 14141. This includes failure to supervise standards, span of control and unity of command standards. This will include review of topics such as performance evaluations, use of early warning systems and supervisory monitoring/ intervention.

Module Two:

Use of Force Investigations

This topic area will review the required process for supervisors to conduct use of force investigations after an officer uses force and the review of proper police practices which are outlined by litigation and Department of Justice consent decrees. This module will review the requirements of interviewing witnesses, documentation of evidence and injuries, interview of the subject officer and review of the officer's use of force report.

Module Three:

Technology in Law Enforcement Supervision

This topic area will cover management issues involving topics such as the use of technology in daily operation. This will include expectation of privacy issues, seizing of individual mobile phones to include electronic discovery in criminal and civil litigation. Specifically, how the use and seizure of personally owned and department owned electronic devices effects daily operations. This topic area will also include the effects of social networking to include Facebook, Twitter and much more on the daily operation of the department.

Module Four:

Current Trends in Supervision

This topic area will review the recommended practice of conducting an effective internal affairs investigation. This will review the citizen complaint process, the proper investigation protocols and the pitfalls found in labor hearings or civil litigation.

Module Four will also address proper standards to protects constitutional rights specific to the subjects of bias based policing, investigatory detentions, crowd management and Americans with Disabilities Act.

Supervisors are required to take the Basic Supervisory Liability course prior to enrolling in this training.
