



Get Connected and Feel Protected

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In January of 2016, many Georgia Medicaid providers received alarming communication indicating that they owed **significant sums of money** to reimburse Medicaid for claims from 2013 and 2014. GPA's Insurance and Managed Care Committee Chair, Dr. Frank Harbin, immediately responded to the situation with advocacy on the issue. In the end, the resolution saved colleagues thousands in Medicaid reimbursements.

GPA was successful in getting legislation passed that clarifies the definition of **psychological testing in Georgia** law. Dr. Daniel Rogers and GPA's team of lobbyists led the effort to get the **bill passed** in March of 2016.



GPA's robust Diversity Directorate programming was recognized when the association **won the 2016 Division 31 Award for Outstanding Diversity Programming from the American Psychological Association**. Initiatives included participation in public forums, multicultural community health fairs and social service projects.

GPA led several initiatives to educate the public about significant social issues, including public forums and health fairs.

Since 2015, GPA has been a partner with the **Georgia Autism Assessment Collaborative**, a project that aims to build capacity of licensed psychologists in Georgia to provide diagnostic assessments for young children suspected of having an Autism Spectrum Disorder. To date, approximately **30 psychologists have been trained** with more free training occurring this year.
