Summary

General Responsibilities:

The faculty member shall be responsible for the following: teaching assigned classes under the supervision of the area dean; helping students fulfill their maximum potential in mastering course content; assessing student learning outcomes; maintaining a thorough and up-to-date knowledge in his/her regular teaching field; continuing professional development; utilizing current technology in the performance of job duties; maintaining standards of professional conduct and ethics appropriate to the professional position; assisting with articulation and curriculum development and review; serving on college committees and participating in faculty governance including accreditation and student co-curricular activities; assuming other responsibilities as assigned by the area dean; fulfilling other duties and responsibilities of a full time faculty member as outlined in the college faculty handbook.

The Fashion department at American River College is a career/transfer program designed for students who have a personal or career interest in Fashion Design and/or Merchandising.

The department organizes and stages department fashion shows, coordinates with the work experience program, and promotes our fashion program to the community. The Fashion Assistant Professor is also a faculty advisor to the student club.

The department maintains a focus on:

- Utilizing industry-related software such as Adobe Illustrator and Adobe Photoshop
- Effectively maintaining knowledge of the fashion Industry history and trends
- Making the subject matter inclusive in terms of gender and culture; and
- Awareness of social issues of visual culture.
- Developing and maintaining curriculum and course development that meets industry practices and labor market needs; teaching and learning theory of fashion; information resources and evaluating student outcomes; and, assisting students to develop critical thinking skills.
- Communicating clearly orally and in writing with a diverse campus community.
- Working effectively and professionally with colleagues and members of the campus community.
- Using teaching methods that engage students and encourage them to be motivated self-learners.

Assignment Responsibilities

The instructional assignment may include, but is not limited to, teaching courses in:

- Introduction to the Fashion Industry
- Textiles
- Fashion Analysis
- Fashion Promotion
- Retail Buying
- Visual Merchandising
- Fashion Illustration
- Apparel Construction classes

The faculty assignment may also include organizing and staging of department fashion shows; coordinating with the work experience program, and curriculum development, recruitment, guidance, and tutoring of individual students and alliance with community activities as well as professional organizations.

Teaching assignment may include day, evening, on-line, television courses, podcasts, hybrid, weekend, and/or off campus classes.

Minimum Qualifications

1. Have a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution, completed by August 17, 2017; AND two years of work experience directly related to the teaching assignment; OR, any associate degree AND six years of work experience directly related to the teaching assignment; OR, hold a California Community College Instructor's Credential in the discipline area; OR, the equivalent.*

2. Have sensitivity to and understanding of the diverse academic socioeconomic, cultural, disability, gender identity, sexual orientation, and ethnic backgrounds of community college students, including those with physical or learning disabilities as it relates to differences in learning styles.

*Note: Applicants applying under the "equivalent" provision must attach details and explain how their academic preparation is the equivalent of the degrees listed above.

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
