The instructor will teach a broad range of apparel design and product development courses including core courses required in both apparel design and fashion merchandising programs. The successful candidate may expect to begin on or about September 1, 2017. Position is for one year, renewable for a total of three years, subject to satisfactory performance, departmental needs and availability of funding.

The successful candidate will demonstrate a strong ability to teach courses required in both apparel design and fashion merchandising programs, have strong knowledge of fashion business, leverage technology to support student learning, and collaborate with teams of instructors to improve teaching.
