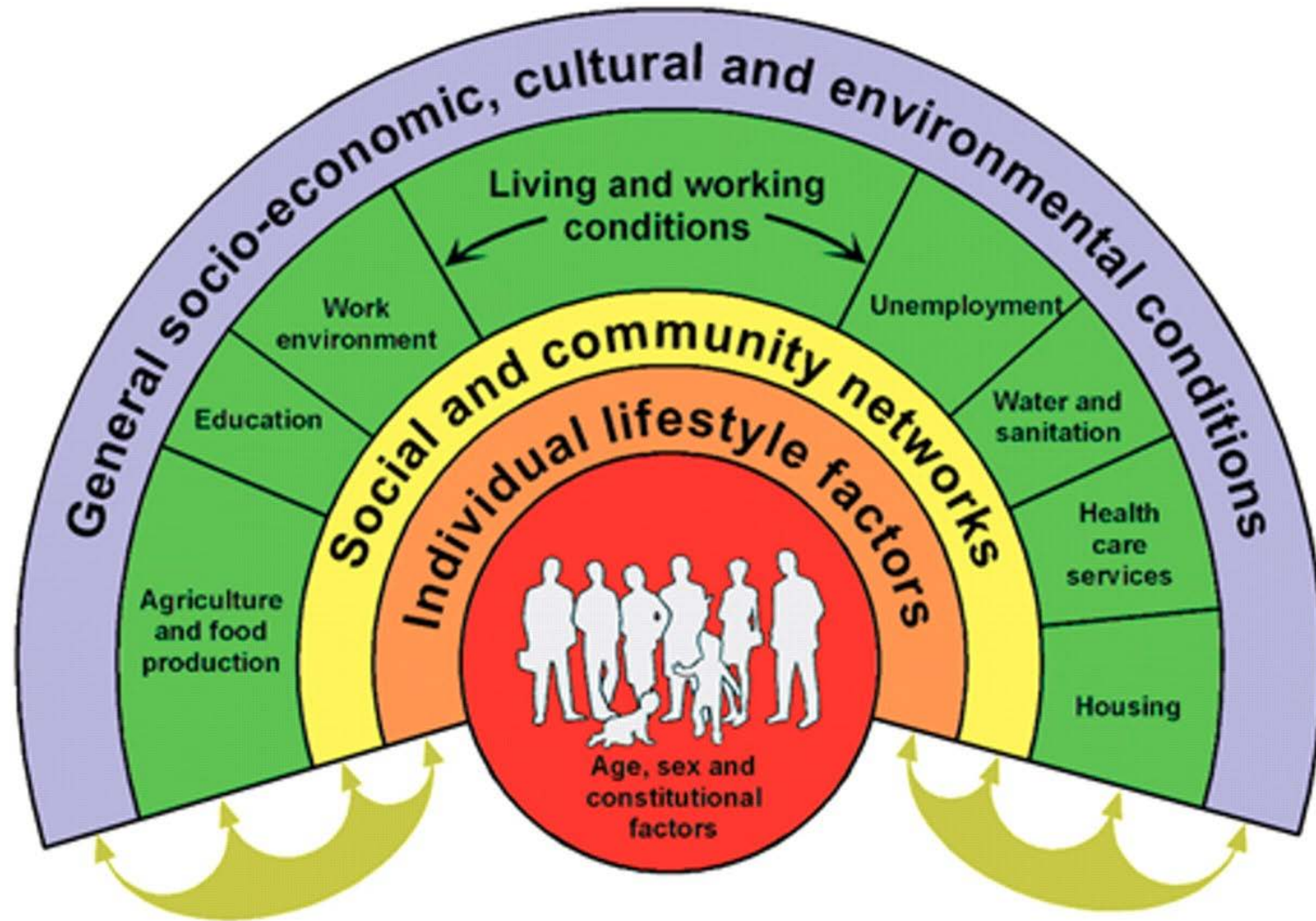
What are CHATs?

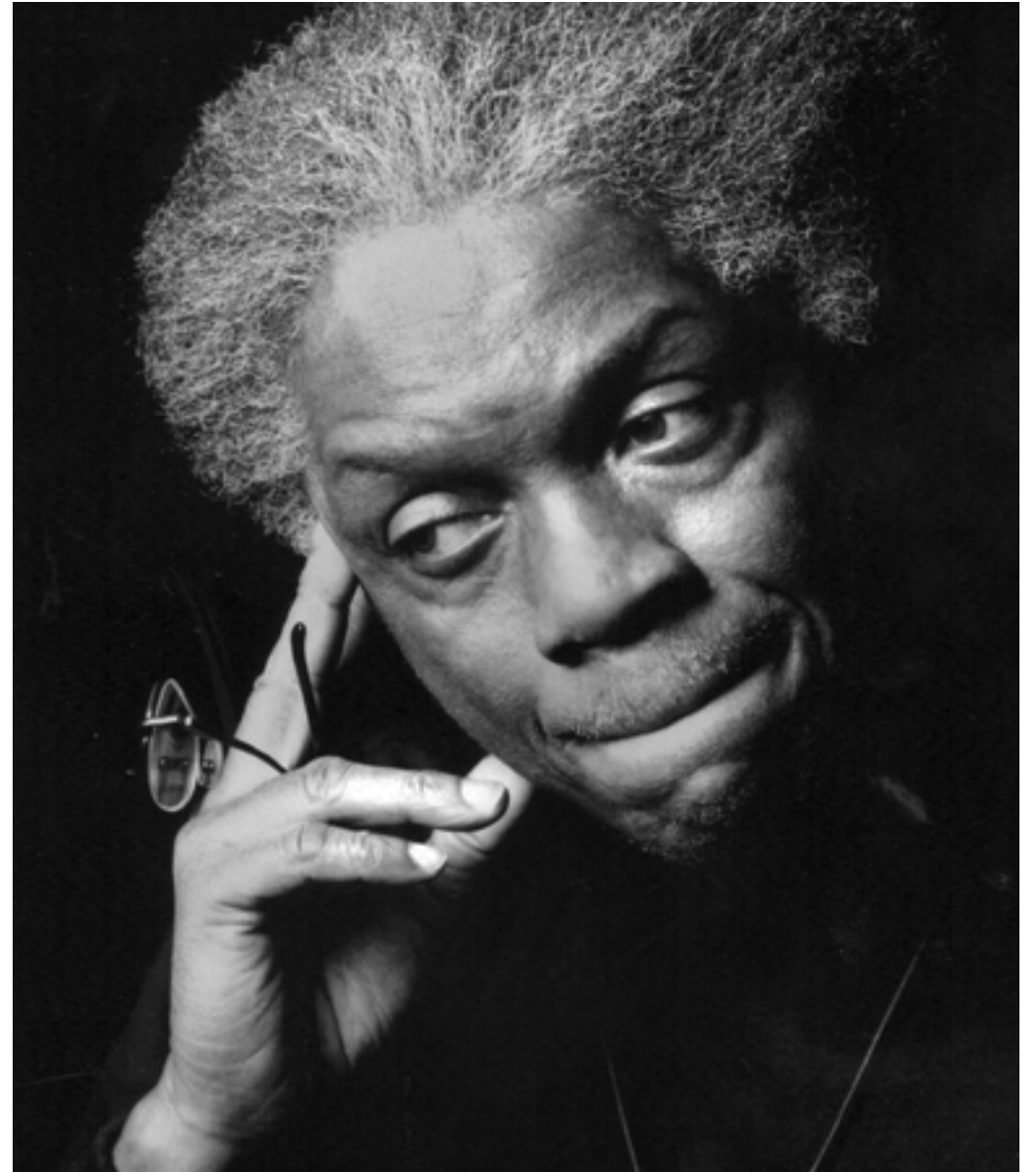
