



ADVANCED PHARMACOLOGY FOR APRN LICENSURE IN OHIO

The program meets the continuing nursing education requirements for advanced practice registered nurses prescriptive authority in the state of Ohio and complies with Ohio House Bill 216. The course includes 42 contact hours of advanced pharmacology consistent with OAC4723-9-02 and 3 contact hours of *Category "A"* instruction in this state and federal laws that govern drugs and prescriptive authority consistent with OAC4723-9-08; OAC4723-9-09; OAC4723-9-10; and OAC4723-9-12 for a total of **45 contact hours** of advanced pharmacology continuing nursing education.

PURPOSE STATEMENT

To enhance the Advanced Practice Nurse knowledge on pharmacokinetic principle and clinical applications of drugs and therapeutic devices in the prevention of illness and maintenance of health and to enhance knowledge on the legal; ethical; and fiscal principles related to prescriptive authority in the state of Ohio.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. Analyze the general principles of pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics as they relate to safe and effective prescribing of drugs and therapeutic devices.
2. Apply pharmacodynamics, pharmacokinetics, pharmacogenomics, potential adverse drug reactions, drug-drug (food, environment) interactions, and contraindications of a variety of specific drugs and devices used in pharmacotherapeutics to the prevention of illness and maintenance of health across the life span.
3. Apply evidence based guidelines to identify current drugs of choice for prevention of illness and maintenance of health in cardiovascular, respiratory, vascular, immune, infectious, inflammatory, endocrine, gastrointestinal, skeletal, muscular, nervous system, and genitourinary systems.
4. Propose evidence based pharmacotherapeutic strategies for schedule II controlled substances and non-opioid drugs use in pain management for a variety of pathological conditions.
5. Explain Federal and Ohio Laws and Rules governing prescriptive authority and the prescribing of drugs, Schedule II controlled substances, and therapeutic devices.
6. Discuss fiscal and ethical implications of prescribing drugs, Schedule II controlled substances, and therapeutic devices.
7. Develop strategies that apply informatics for obtaining sustained up-to-date drug and therapeutic device information for prescriptive practice.
