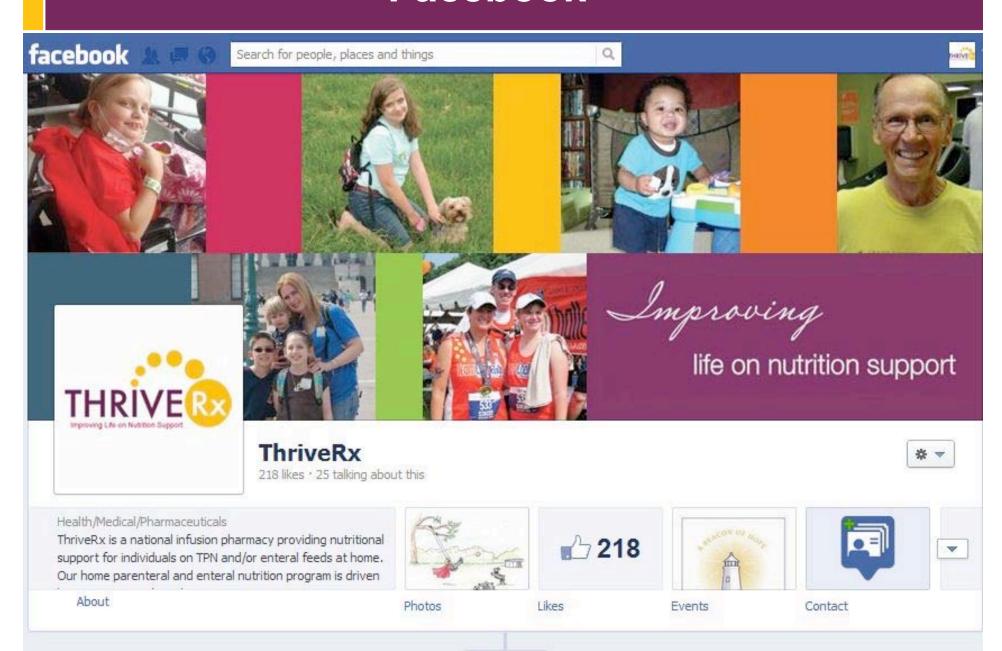

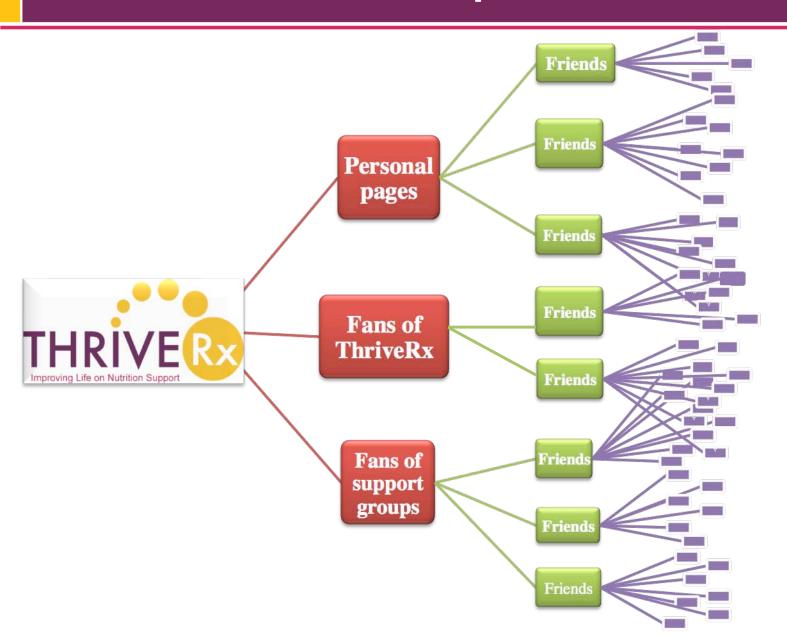

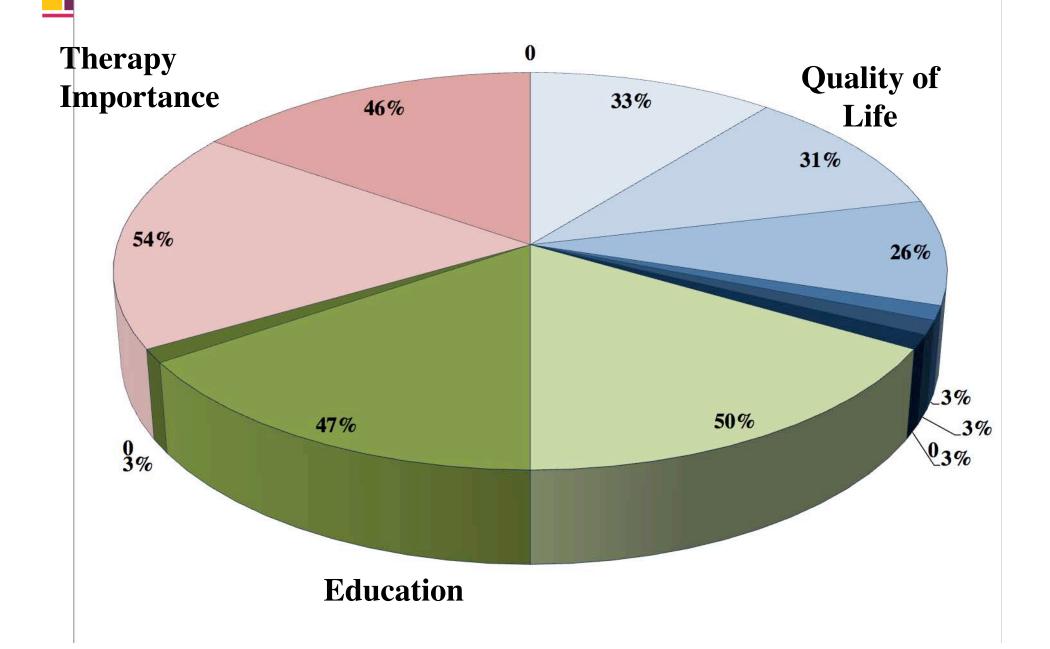

### **New HPN Consumer FAQ's**

### There is so much to learn. How will I ever learn to manage it all and how will I teach my family members?

Just like with any new thing you ever learned, in the beginning there is a lot to learn with many steps. But, the more you practice the faster your preparation will go and what was once difficult will become automatic. The best time for your family to learn is the same time as you are learning.

### Am I the only person on Home Parenteral Nutrition (HPN)?

No, there are many people just like you and it is possible to meet them. The best place to get started is the Oley Foundation, nonprofit organization for individual on Nutrition Support. The place of the place of the support of the support of the support. Meeting others like you is a great source of inspiration and support.

### Life with HPN seems so overwhelming. Will it get easier?

Yes, in the beginning there is a lot to learn and keep track of but, in time you will learn a schedule that helps keep all that comes with HPN easier to manage. Eventually you will find that the therapy will take up less and less time of your life.

### Life on HPN sound so different than the life I had before, will I ever get my life back?

While life on HPN does take away some spontaneity in life, it does not mean that you can never have a life similar to the one you had before. With time you and your medical team will learn how make your medical schedule fit your life and you will be able to do most of what you did before. It takes work, but you can get very close to where you were before.

### Will I ever be able to join, or re-enter the workforce?

Once one becomes acclimated to the daily routine of nutritional support therapy, many people return to parttime or full-time employment. Take time to understand and educate yourself on your condition.

#### Is there a way to reduce or eliminate my need for nutrition therapy?

While HPN therapy has saved the lives of many consumers, an understanding of your medical and anatomical condition, along with knowledge of proper nutrition and hydration is important. There is information available on websites, and with online groups of people on nutrition support that have successful outcomes. Refer to the Oley Foundation, your medical team, or Nutrition support team for initial direction.

### It seems like HPN is going to take over my life, will it get better?

Yes, in the beginning it will take over your life. But as you get used to being on the therapy and used to the routine, things will get better. It is possible to still have a life while on HPN. It will always be there but you will find it easier to go out and do things you want to do.

### A Clinician's Guide

History: To better understand the challenges faced by new Home PN consumers we created a survey that was distributed to individuals with HPN experience and with chosen HPN support groups. We posed the question: What should every new HPN consumer know about life on HPN? Respondents could answer in an open-ended format that allowed for personalized answers, and/or vote for answers provided by other respondents. This created an evolving multiple choice survey. The flexibility provided by the social media networking platform allowed current and past HPN consumers to share personal insight that would have been limited through the use of set survey responses. The information gathered was used to develop the following talking points:

### What current HPN consumers what your client to know:

- Life on HPN is hard and scary at the beginning, but most consumers find that it gets easier as time goes on.
- You can still live your life while on TPN. Do what you love, in spite of tubes.
- Keep asking questions, get organized, and you can do just about anything
- · Take control of your HPN. While HPN can be overwhelming, it is best not to allow it to control of your life.
- HPN saves lives....it saves mine or my child's life day after day!

### How can you help new HPN patients:

#### · Let them know they are not alone:

Provide information about pertinent support organizations; including local and online support groups. Groups like this will enable your new HPN patient to connect with current HPN consumers who will be able to share insight, knowledge and hope. These groups can also help your new HPN patient and their family adapt to life on HPN and the challenges that come with it. List of support groups can be found at ThriveRx.net or Oley.org.

#### Welcome them as Part of their Care team:

Encourage them become part of their medical team. The more involved in their care they are the better it will be for both of you. Either when they first go home or in time, they will have many questions. They need to know it is ok to ask whatever they need.
