



Marshall Barton, Head of Legal, Animal Health US, Boehringer-Ingelheim

Marshall has been with Boehringer Ingelheim (and its recently acquired sub Merial) for twelve years. During that time, she has held various roles and supported many aspects of the Animal Health business. In February of this year, after BI's acquisition of Merial closed in January, Marshall was named Head of Legal, Animal Health US, for the combined US Animal Health businesses of BI Vetmedica and Merial with approximately \$2 billion in combined annual sales. In this role, she serves on the US Animal Health Leadership Team and is responsible for managing a team of four lawyers, four paralegals, and one administrative assistant that provides legal support to all aspects of BI's US Animal Health Business. Previously, Marshall was appointed General Counsel, North America, Oceania & CAMCA for Merial in 2015, and from 2013-2015, she served as Merial's Global Compliance & Business Ethics Officer.

Prior to joining BI, Marshall practiced law for eleven years in the commercial litigation departments of two large international firms based in Atlanta, King & Spalding LLP and Troutman Sanders LLP, and at The Coca-Cola Company. In these roles, she handled a variety of complex cases, class actions, arbitrations, and mediations. Marshall also served on various law firm committees, including the associate mentoring and women's leadership development committees.

Marshall earned her JD from the College of William & Mary and a BS *magna cum* from Vanderbilt University. Marshall is active in several civic and charitable organizations where she serves in various leadership capacities (Director, United Way, Gwinnett Advisory Board (2016-present); President, Vice President, and Director, William & Mary Law School Alumni Association (2010-present); Chair, Vice Chair, and Director, Board of Directors, Rainbow Village, a long term transitional housing program for homeless families (2010-2016); President and Director, WCSSC Charities, Inc., a charitable fundraising organization for local charities (2010-present); Co-chair and committee member, *Leadership Gwinnett* Education and Economics Learning Day Committees (2011-present); and Vice Chair and Director, Hi-Hope Service Center for developmentally disabled adults (2012-2015)).
