- Argued the redistricting case *League of United Latin American Citizens v. Perry*, and the voter ID case *Purcell v. Gonzalez* in the Supreme Court

- Argued three redistricting cases: *Cooper v. Harris*, *Behune-Hill v. Virginia State Board of Elections*, and *Wittman v. Personhuballah* in the Supreme Court

- Argued more than a dozen cases in the Supreme Court, including the one-person-one-vote case *Evenwel v. Abbott*

- Co-developed the “efficiency gap,” an analytical tool for measuring partisan effects, relied on by the redistricting challengers in *Gill v. Whitford* (argued in the Supreme Court on October 3, 2017)
