## Message from the President

Please join us in Milwaukee for the 56th Joint Annual Meeting of the Judicial Conference of the Seventh Circuit and Seventh Circuit Bar Association.

The meeting kicks off Sunday night with an opening cocktail reception at the brand new Discovery World at Pier Wisconsin Center on Lake Michigan. In addition to good food, music, and conversation, we promise you two new aquariums, wonderful views of the lake, the city, and the Calatrava addition to the Milwaukee Art Museum.

Monday night's dinner will feature Circuit Justice John Paul Stevens who will provide his usual insightful comments. Solicitor General Paul Clement, a Cedarburg Wisconsin native, will provide the keynote address, and we'll honor this year's deserving recipient of the American Inns of Court Professionalism Award, Justice Janine Geske, Distinguished Professor of Law, Marquette University Law School.

Monday's substantive programming will provide a variety of viewpoints on media coverage of the courts; first with a discussion including journalists who have covered the Supreme Court for national newspapers (LA Times, Chicago Tribune, McClatchy Newspapers, USA Today), and then with a panel including some of the nation's leading law bloggers ("Althouse," "How Appealing," "Empirical Legal Studies," "Prawfsblog," "Conglomerate," and the "Volokh Conspiracy"). USA Today reporter Joan Biskupic starts the morning off and will share her insights on these same issues based on her many years covering the Supreme Court and her work on the biography of Justice Sandra Day O'Connor.

We'll shift our focus in the afternoon and hear from 7th Circuit lawyers who have helped Iraq develop a constitution (Brady Williamson) and deal with the legal issues presented within the "Green Zone" of Baghdad (Jim Santelle).

We'll then turn to a debate moderated by Chief Judge Frank Easterbrook between Judge Richard Posner and University of Chicago Professor Geoffrey Stone on "Constitutional Rights and Other Legal Issues in the War on Terror." The debate will be followed by a panel on "Privacy, Evidence Gathering and the Fourth Amendment in the Modern Technological Age."

Tuesday morning begins with the popular Young Lawyers Breakfast, which is an excellent opportunity for the judiciary and younger members of the Association to spend some time together in an informal setting.

Tuesday's programming begins with a memorial tribute to former Chief Judge Thomas Fairchild, and then Clerk of Court Gino Agnello's annual and entertaining presentation on the work of the courts. Next up are programs on "Criminal Restitution as a Supplement to (or Substitute for) Civil Litigation," and separate breakouts on bankruptcy, criminal law issues, and intellectual property litigation. We'll wrap up the programming with breakouts by districts focusing on current issues in the courts, including the role of *pro se* litigation, the effective use of local rules and practices, and e-discovery.

Spring in Milwaukee can be beautiful; we hope to see you here for an interesting and informative program.
