Returning Educational Scholarship Program Promoting Code Enforcement Profession at  
AACE Conference October 23-27, 2017

Safeguard Properties, a longstanding partner and dedicated supporter of AACE, is pleased to announce that it will continue its tradition of offering 8 scholarships to the Annual Educational Code Conference in Hebron, KY.

Safeguard knows that your city's budget for education may prohibit sending you to an AACE conference. This limits you from expanding your current skill sets, learning about what's new in the world of code enforcement, and from networking with professional colleagues from around the country. For this reason, the Community Initiatives Department created the Scholarship Program in 2011 and has since sent over 50 officers from nearly 25 states to the annual AACE conference.

The scholarship award will cover your registration fee as well as the lodging cost for a four-night stay at the Cincinnati Airport Marriott – the conference hotel. This is a total value of over \$900.

## **Here's how to enter and some helpful guidelines**

Simply author an essay that is up to 350 words in length.

Essays must be written by scholarship applicants and address the questions listed below.

Email your essay and supervisor/manager consent with Safeguard Scholarship in the subject line to AACE President Greg Carr at [president@ace1.org](mailto:president@ace1.org) by 5pm CT on Tuesday, August 1<sup>st</sup>.

Scholarship winners will be notified by August 15<sup>th</sup> and announced in the AACE Newsletter.

## **A winning essay!**

Partnership is a key pillar of Safeguard and the foundation for the Community Initiatives Department. To qualify, please answer the following questions in an essay.

How does your department define partnership?

What are your department's goals or anticipated outcomes for a partnership?

Since public-private partnerships can be essential for many efforts or programs, describe a public-private partnership that your department has either initiated or utilized.

Explain any successes or challenges. Tell us what worked and what didn't. Describe what you learned along the way and how any goals or objectives were met.

Although preference will be given to first-time conference attendees, those who have not attended an AACE conference within the past 5 years are eligible to submit an essay.

Please note, written confirmation from a direct supervisor or manager authorizing your attendance must accompany your essay submission. Essays without the approval of your supervisor or manager will not be considered.
