Tisha Johnson is the University of Kentucky General Preventive Medicine – Public Health Residency Director and Assistant Professor at the College of Public Health. Dr. Johnson is also a staff physician in primary care at the Lexington Veterans Affairs Medical Center. She is boarded in Preventive Medicine and Internal Medicine. Previously, she served as the 14th Luther L. Terry Fellow within the Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health and Human Services, working on training projects related to preventing adverse drug events and health literacy. Dr. Johnson received her medical training at Youngstown State University and Northeast Ohio Medical University in a combined BS/MD program.
