



# MATERNAL FETAL TRIAGE INDEX

## Implementation Community

AWHONN’s Maternal Fetal Triage Index (MFTI) Implementation Community supports leaders to implement evidence-based initiatives with support from AWHONN staff and learning from their fellow leaders in the community. Details of the MFTI Implementation Community are below.

### The MFTI Implementation Community includes:

- Up to 50 seats for online education
- Three 75-minute conference calls to support implementation of the MFTI and discuss integration of the MFTI in the electronic medical record. Learn from other Implementation Community members and the AWHONN staff team.
- Audio recordings of the Implementation Community conference calls.
- License to integrate the MFTI into the participating facility’s electronic medical record.
- Access to Implementation Community resources and discussion forums on the Implementation Community group web page.

### OVERVIEW:

AWHONN developed the MFTI to provide a standardized approach for obstetric triage. The MFTI is a five-level acuity tool for nurses to use when they triage a woman presenting for care to a birth unit in order to prioritize the woman’s urgency for provider evaluation. It is the first obstetric acuity tool developed by a professional society for use across the United States. The MFTI Implementation Community calls will include discussion of MFTI education, integration of the MFTI into the EMR, and implementing the MFTI into practice.
