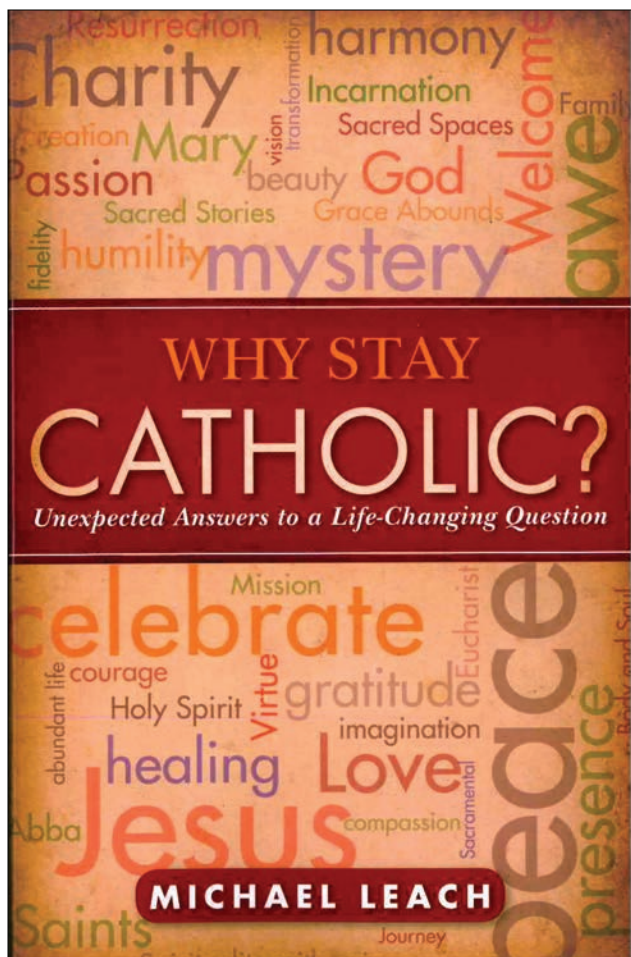

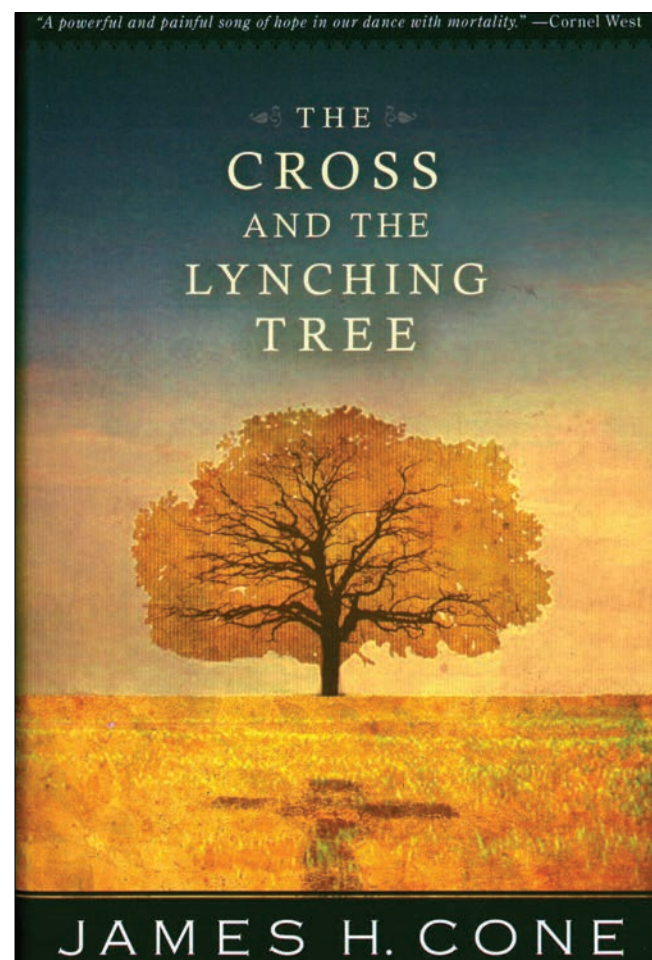
Second Place

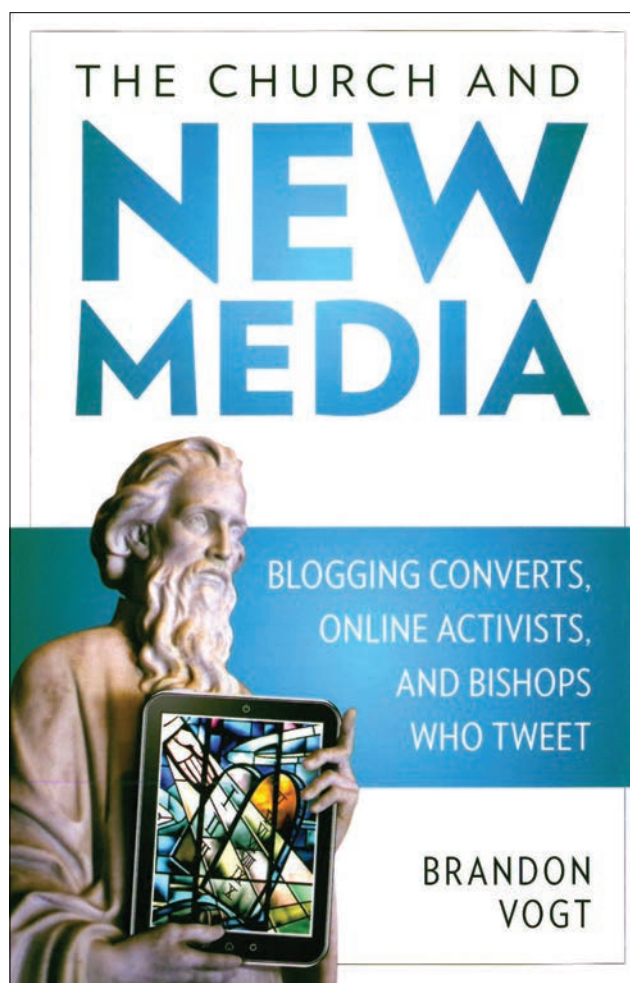

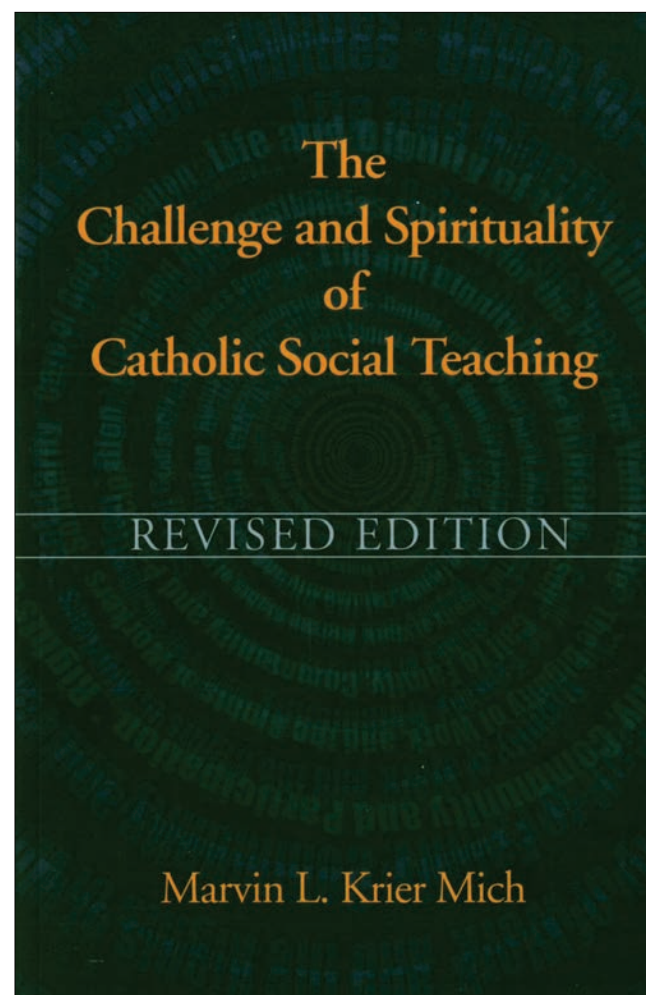

All Is Grace - A Biography of Dorothy Day, Jim Forest, Orbis Books, Maryknoll, N.Y.

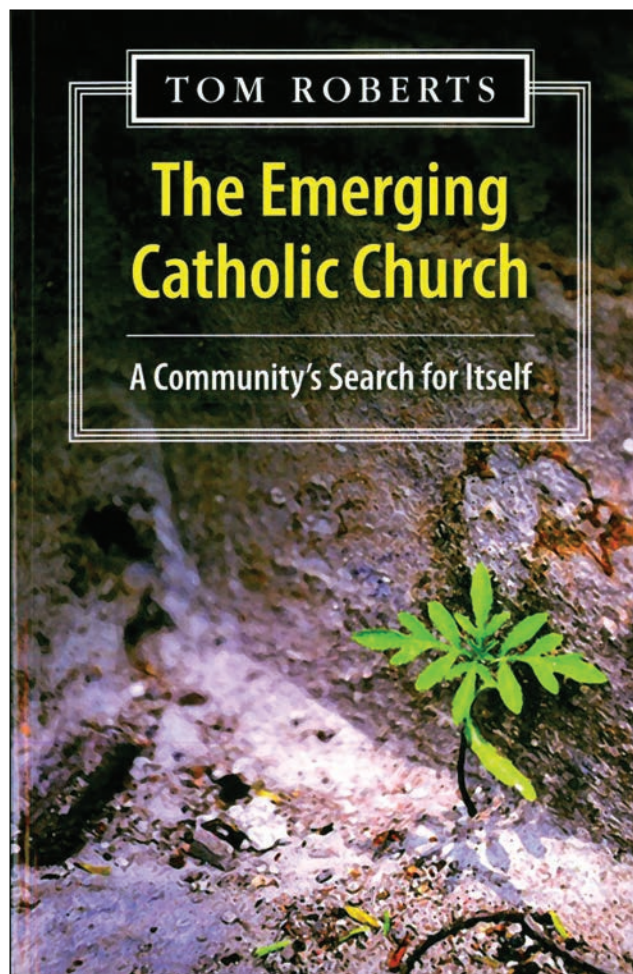

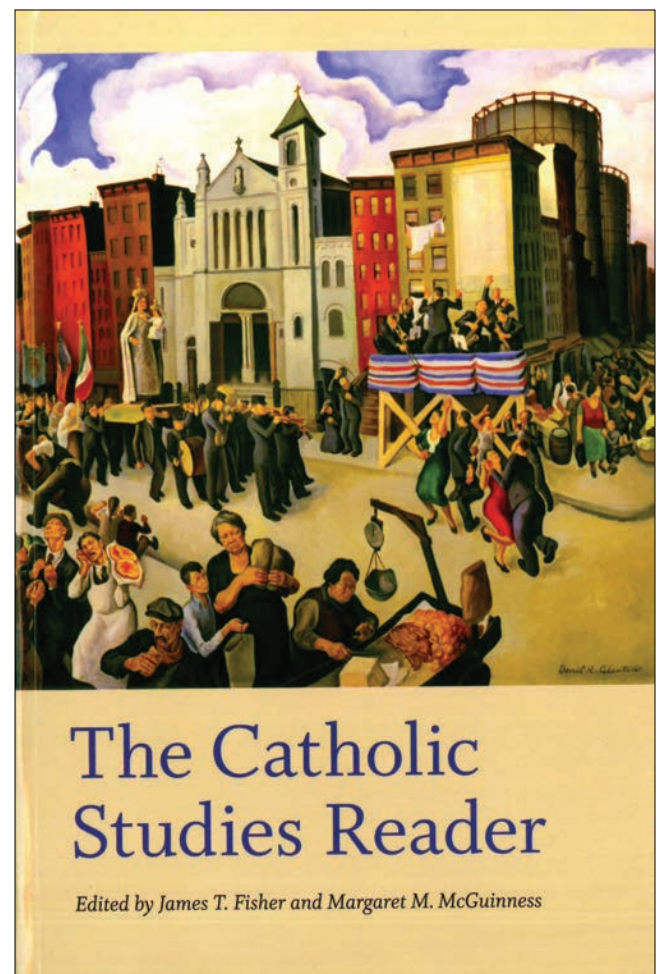

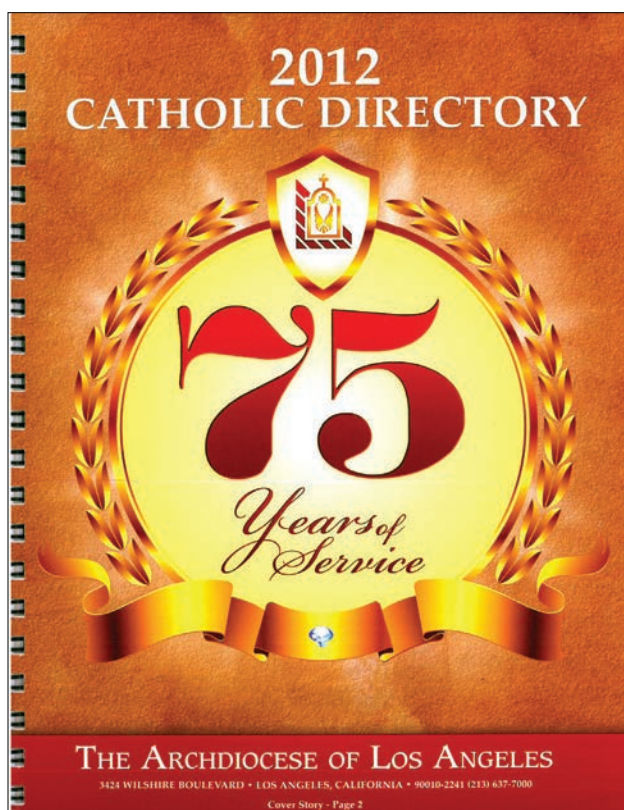
