You may quote from the Foundation's materials without express written permission if you properly cite the quote in your publication and do not quote more than 10% of a copyrighted work or two pages, whichever is smaller. For this type of quotation, please cite it in the appropriate format listed below (for more information on appropriate citation, please see "Documentation 1: Basic Patterns" in *The Chicago Manual of Style*, 15th Edition):

a. Endnote format (endnotes go at the end of a chapter or section)
