Infill & Redevelopment Tour

This tour travels to the north part of Palm Beach County to the waterfront community of Jupiter where the vision of the Town Council has created unique zoning and land use categories and special districts meant to set aside waterfront for the public and to preserve the small-town feel. The tour will emphasize the redevelopment and infill of the Inlet Village and the US One/Intracoastal Waterway Districts. Explore the successes and challenges to get there with two of the planners/landscape architects involved.

Downtown Delray Beach: Experience a Successful Downtown Revitalization

Frog Alley Focuses on Food and Gray Mockingbird focuses on food production for the wider community. Each Community garden has had its own source of funding and has its own program of operations.
