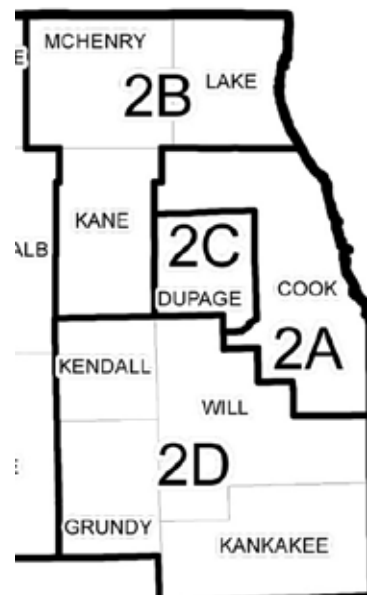
Owen now lives in Arlington Heights with his wife Karen. They have two sons, Kyle and Ryan, who are attending college.

Steve Wilson

Steve Wilson is a Groundwater Hydrologist at the Illinois State Water Survey, University of Illinois. He manages www.WaterOperator.org, a national technical assistance and training website, funded by the Rural Community Assistance Partnership and US EPA. Steve has been in the Groundwater Section at the ISWS since January of 1983, where he started as a student hourly. His work focuses on applied research related to groundwater and wells, as well as outreach to water and wastewater operators, regulators, and other stakeholders in the water industry. He has worked extensively throughout Illinois looking at issues such as arsenic in the Mahomet Aquifer and unconventional methods of arsenic treatment, in addition to managing groundwater quantity and quality data collection programs around the state.

Steve currently manages The Private Well Class, an online education program for private well owners, is in charge of irrigation water use reporting in the state, and is a collaborator on a national program for getting innovative treatment technologies in place for small systems. Steve has worked with over 25 federal, state, and private partners and led over 40 research projects at the ISWS. He is the past director of the Midwest Technology Assistance Center at the I of I, and past Chair of the Illinois Groundwater Association.

Steve serves on the Rural Water Subcommittee of the National Ground Water Association, the Illinois Section AWWA Small Systems Committee, the National AWWA Small Systems Outreach Services Committee (currently acting-Chair), and is a trustee and Vice-Chair of the Small Systems Division of AWWA. Steve has a BS in Agricultural Engineering, BS in Agricultural Science, and a MS in Civil Engineering, all from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Ann-Perry Witmer

Ann-Perry Witmer, P.E., is a licensed professional engineer, as well as a LEED accredited professional. She currently teaches at the University of Illinois College of Engineering, through its Illinois Engineering First-Year Experience program.
