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1) Governor Proposes Fall Elections in State of the State

Last night, Governor Brownback delivered the State of the State address. The address covered several topics including school funding and the judicial selection process. Most important to cities, however, was Governor Brownback's proposal to move local elections to the fall, because of low voter turnout in the spring.

While a bill has not yet been introduced in the Legislature to move elections to the fall, now is the time to start talking to your legislators about the importance of keeping local elections in the spring. [A copy of talking points may be found here.](#) We encourage you to talk with your legislators about this issue, if it is important to your city.

2) State Budget Update

This morning, Governor Brownback provided his budget proposal to the Legislature. [The proposal may be accessed online here.](#) League staff is currently studying the proposal to determine its impact on local governments. We will have a further update on the proposal next week.

3) Hearing on New Annexation Bill

The House Local Government Committee will hear testimony on [HB 2003](#) on Tuesday, January 20 at 1:30 p.m. in room number 281-N. [HB 2003](#) would take away a city's ability to annex city-owned property that does not adjoin the city without seeking county commission authority.

In addition, the bill would require unanimous approval by a county commission for all annexations of land that do not adjoin the city, not just city owned property. Under the bill, the county commission would have to make a finding that the annexation would not cause manifest injury to the owners of the land surrounding the property to be annexed. The League will be testifying in opposition to [HB 2003](#).

4) Tips on Effective Advocacy

The 2015 legislative session is in full swing with several hearings starting next week. As city officials, it is important to establish a relationship with your legislators to effectively communicate your city's agenda and priorities.

5) Register for City Hall Day

City Hall Day will be held in Topeka on Wednesday, February 4, with the morning reserved for meeting with legislators, and an afternoon program that includes legislative updates, tips for advocating your community's interests, and a reception.

Mayors are also invited to attend the Kansas Mayors Association Luncheon from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. The luncheon will include a free meal with fellow mayors and the student winners of the "If I Were Mayor" contest, along with legislative updates from several legislators.

Contact your House and Senate members in advance to schedule meetings to discuss issues of concern to your city, along with the League Action Agenda. City Hall Day will be free of charge to all city officials and legislators, but please register so that we can get an accurate headcount.
