Registration:

Registration for Training Conference 2018 must be completed online by visiting the NACA website: www.nacenet.org

If you need to pay via purchase order, or with an agency check, simply choose the pay by check, or bill me option, and an invoice will be emailed to you for submission to your accounts payable department. Registration Fees :

The registration fee for Training Conference 2018 is \$275.00** for NACA Members, and \$300.00** for non-members. Members must be logged in to the NACA website when registering to receive the member price, no refunds will be given. Registration includes conference materials, exhibit area admission, the NACA Awards Luncheon, breaks, and the Thursday night reception.

The registration fee for the ABA Shelter Law Symposium is \$50.00, and must be paid directly to the ABA.

Registration Deadline / Refunds:

The registration deadline for NACA Training Conference 2018 is September 15, 2018. Refunds will be given if requested prior to the September 15, 2018 registration deadline. All refunds will be subject to a 25% non-refundable administration fee. No refunds will be given after September 15, 2018.

Location:

Training Conference 2018 will be held at the Crowne Plaza Denver Airport Convention Center in Denver, Colorado. A block of rooms has been set aside for this conference. Reservations must be made before **September 15, 2018**. Each participant is responsible for making their own hotel reservations. Room rates begin at \$119.00 plus tax for single/double occupancy. The special NACA room rate is valid for hotel accommodations 10/9- 10/14, 2018. Reservations made after September 15, 2018 will be provided on a space-available basis and may be charged at the hotel's regular room rate. All reservations made within the group block must be guaranteed with a major credit card, or an advanced deposit. 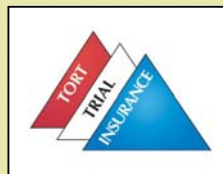
