Supplies and Equipment for Hands-on Workshops Taught at Each Annual Symposium

 - Goal: \$3,000 to \$10,000 per year.
- Symposiums—help NWRA keep attendance affordable for those who dedicate themselves to wildlife. Support all the many details of the largest and most comprehensive educational and training event for wildlife rehabilitators, veterinarians, and educators. Specific sponsorships are available for each annual symposium.
 - Goal: \$30,000 per year.

- Publications—help NWRA expand the primary source of current published material specifically for those who treat and rehabilitate wildlife with the goal of returning wild animals back into their native habitats. Publications are peer-reviewed and professionally edited for accuracy. Currently need financial support:
 - Zoonoses, diseases of wildlife transmissible to humans
 - Opossum Rehabilitation
 - Waterfowl Rehabilitation
 - (more are planned)
 - Goal: \$7,000 to \$8,000 per year. \$3,500 to 4,000 funds the first printing of one publication.
- Scholarships
 - Educational Materials Scholarship—NWRA strives to offer scholarships annually to help wildlife rehabilitators purchase the vital educational and reference publications needed to stay informed and effective. One or more \$200 or \$250 scholarships to qualified individuals helps purchase books, journals, manuals, charts, and other resources. Contact the NWRA office if you would like to sponsor a scholarship like this.
 - Goal: \$200 to \$500 per year to fund one or two scholarships.
 - Cage Building Scholarship—This fund is open to all who wish to donate. Help NWRA members and licensed home-based wildlife rehabilitators build, repair, or renovate caging used exclusively for rehabilitating wildlife.
 - Goal: \$2,000 per year.
