## **Bio-sketches of the Training Course Facilitators**

### **Dr Steven Lacey**

Dr Steven Lacey is an Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Environmental Health Science at the Indiana University Fairbanks School of Public Health (FSPH) in Indianapolis.

Dr Lacey earned an MS in Industrial Hygiene from Texas A&M University, and a PhD in the same from the University of Illinois at Chicago, and was a postdoctoral fellow at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Prior to Indianapolis, he was the Director of the Industrial Hygiene programme at the Illinois NIOSH ERC. His current research focuses on medical laser health and safety.

A Certified Industrial Hygienist and Certified Safety Professional, Dr Lacey currently serves as the Immediate Past President of the American Industrial Hygiene Association (AIHA).

### **Dr Emily Ahonen**

Dr Emily Ahonen is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Environmental Health Science and the Department of Social and Behavioural Sciences at the Indiana University Fairbanks School of Public Health (FSPH) in Indianapolis.

Dr Ahonen earned a MPH degree in Community and International Health, and a PhD in Public Health, both from the Universitat Pompeu Fabra, in Barcelona, Spain. She studies work and housing as they interact with health and well-being, and the ways in which the quality of these is distributed across groups, impeding the achievement of health equity in populations. She also evaluates interventions, both to understand processes and to demonstrate outcomes in a variety of public health challenges.

Prior to joining the FSPH, Dr Ahonen spent several years at the University of Illinois at Chicago, as a faculty member and a post-doctoral researcher, and also worked in health promotion with migrant agricultural workers in the US state of Michigan.

### **Dr Perry Logan**

Dr Perry Logan is currently the global manager for 3M Corporate Ergonomics, Industrial Hygiene and is Leader for 3M's Global EHS Team providing EHS leadership, technical support and governance to manufacturing operations worldwide.

He holds degrees in chemical engineering (BS), industrial hygiene (MS) and environmental health (PhD), and is a certified industrial hygienist (CIH).

Dr Logan enjoys all aspects of EHS and often presents technical sessions on leadership, EHS competency development, EHS auditing, professional judgment, exposure risk assessment and management, ventilation design, and Bayesian and mathematical exposure modelling.
