

Sigma Phi Society Summer Independent Study Opportunity

For the first time, Sigma Phi Society is offering an independent study opportunity for brothers to collaborate with the leaders of the national organization. As Sigma Phi continues to lead within the fraternal community through the implementation of its new strategic plan, this unique opportunity will allow undergraduate brothers to be exposed to the inner-workings of a national fraternal organization.

We are looking for 2-3 students to start on June 1 and ends July 31. You are expected to participate for 30 hours a week. The work will be conducted remotely and you can be based anywhere that you choose, although there may be opportunities for travel.

This is unlike almost any summer opportunities. Students will be working directly with the chief decision makers in Sigma Phi; and will be responsible for their own projects. While each will receive guidance and coaching on how to fulfill objectives, students will be chiefly responsible for how to successfully implement their projects.

The ideal candidate is somebody who is a self-starter, can easily connect with people, works well in a team, and is dedicated to the values and principals of Sigma Phi.

All students will be working on implementing the Careers and Mentoring initiative. They will focus on how to better establish relationships between alumni and undergraduates, how to connect alumni based on region, and profession, and developing mechanisms so that Sigma Phi can provide support for undergraduates to develop professionally. Additionally, students will have exposure to fundraising through the development of prospects and enhancing communication within Sigma Phi.

What you will learn:

1. Relationship building with our membership, in part by maintaining constant communication and developing the Career and Mentoring initiative.
2. Fundraising strategies and how to successfully implement a strategic plan.
3. The daily operations of a not-for-profit organization.

What we require:

1. Motivated individual who is able to take initiative
2. Organized, with an ability to prioritize time-sensitive assignments
3. Strong communication skills
4. Interest in nonprofit management and community development
5. Familiarity with social networking sites desired

This independent study will offer more exposure and opportunities to create your own projects and initiatives than most other summer opportunities. We want to ensure that all students receive an experience that fits their career goals.

Each student will receive a scholarship from the Viele Foundation for \$2,500.
