Science Festival and MarineQuest offer FREE Hands-On Science to St. Pete
Ocean Team dream now a reality; five years later and still *growing* strong

ST. PETERBURG, FL - More than seven years after members of the St. Petersburg Ocean Team got together and decided to offer science to the masses, their vision is now a reality along Bayboro Harbor in downtown St. Pete. This year's [Science Festival](#) and [MarineQuest](#) will be held on Saturday, Oct. 17 from 10am-4pm.

Attendees will experience hands-on activities representing the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics fields (STEAM). Festival attendees can see fighting robots, operate marine robots, conduct chemistry experiments, crawl through a sea turtle hurdle and meet a tiny, rare shark.

The day before the FREE Saturday event, more than 1,700 school children are treated to a sneak peak of the festival during organized school trips. The coveted slots go fast and students often come back on Saturday with their parents. The growing interest in STEAM subjects is exciting to event organizers and our Tampa Bay area students.

“We are proud of our regional STEAM community – our goal is to highlight and celebrate its synergies and innovations,” said E. Howard Rutherford, St. Petersburg Science Festival Co-Chair. “The two festivals combined provide a bridge between these subjects and our students and will hopefully foster new professionals for the future. We are excited to share this day with MarineQuest.”

The collaboration with MarineQuest means more people, a bigger geographic footprint, and more STEAM education for everyone. The two festivals together attracted close to 20,000 attendees during the free open house day in 2014.

“The enthusiasm we see for science is why we started MarineQuest twenty-one years ago and why we are thrilled to have the added bonus of the Science Festival,” said Gil McRae, Director of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission’s

Marine Research Institute. “This is what the Ocean Team set out to do, share science and entice young people into the science field.”

Along with hundreds of hands-on activities, the festival will have a main stage featuring live music and entertainment by the New Generation Branches Steel Orchestra, the Dead Ichthyologists, Mad Science, MOSI Steampunks, Boyd Hill Nature Preserve, Funky49, and DrumQuest.
