### COLONEL GLEN M. GENOVE

Colonel Glen M. Genove is the Deputy Director of Air and Cyberspace Operations, Chief Information Officer, and Director of Cyberspace Forces, Headquarters Pacific Air Forces (PACAF), Joint Base Pearl Harbor – Hickam, Hawaii. He is responsible for ensuring PACAF provides ready air, space and cyberspace power to promote United States' interests in the Asia Pacific region during peacetime, crisis and war. In this capacity, Colonel Genove leads the Warfighting Headquarters staff providing cyberspace operations, combat communications, and Command and Control support to the Commander of PACAF, combatant commanders and assigned forces. Furthermore, he directs integrated cyber capabilities across the full range of military operations and oversees cyber operations and sustainment at three Numbered Air Forces and 10 wings. Colonel Genove also oversees air postal mail operations supporting 325,000 joint personnel. Additionally, he manages a \$2.5B C4 portfolio and is the functional leader for over 3,500 cyber personnel.



Colonel Genove was born and raised in the San Francisco Bay Area, and entered the U.S. Air Force in 1993 after graduating with Distinction from the University of California, Berkeley, where he was also an Air Force ROTC Distinguished Graduate.

He held various cyberspace operations, communications and information, and force support positions, serving at the Squadron, Group, Wing, Numbered Air Force, Field Operating Agency, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, and Unified Combatant Command levels. Most recently, Colonel Genove served as the Commander, 435th Air and Space Communications Group, Ramstein Air Base, Germany.
