Personal Achievements:

Alumni Achievement Award for Leadership (2013). The Foote School is a K-9 independent school in New Haven, CT, which values critical thinking and hands-on opportunities that are the hallmarks of experiential learning. Selected by the board of directors for exemplary contributions in the field of educational leadership.

Reba Ferguson Memorial Rookie of the Year Recipient, (2011). Selected by the Colorado Association of Elementary Principals as the outstanding elementary school principal within his or her first three years in the position.

National Distinguished Principal of Colorado, Nominated 2014 & Finalist 2015.

Durango Foundation for Educational Excellence, Principal Recognition 2012, 2013.

Smith Book Award, (1986). Top female student from the graduating class at Wilbur Cross High School in New Haven, CT. Ranked third out of five hundred students.

Animas Valley Elementary School, District 9-R, Durango, CO (2008-2015). Principal, PK-5 approximately 300 students.

School Achievements:

Closing the Achievement Gap, (2014, 2015). Animas Valley's 1-Year School Performance Framework showed student growth percentiles exceeded state expectations in ALL categories. Minority students excelled with 80 median growth percentile in reading, 75 in writing and 77 in mathematics. Rated an "A" school by ColoradoSchoolGrades and ranked in the top 10% of elementary schools across the state.

International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme School, (2010-2015). Led staff, students, parents and community through the feasibility phase; submission process of application A & B; as well as ongoing implementation of IB policies and standards. Fully authorized July 2013.

Durango Foundation for Educational Excellence Innovation Award, (2014). Bank of Colorado granted \$5,000 to implement a program to teach reading to English-language learners, which requires a different approach than teaching reading to native speakers. The methods were devised by the Center for Applied Linguistics.

Governor's Distinguished Improvement Award, (2011). Animas Valley Elementary was the only school in La Plata County recognized by Colorado Department of Education for high academic student growth.

High-Performing School Award, (2009). Colorado Department of Education named Animas Valley a "High-Performing" school based on exceptional student growth in mathematics. Results indicated Animas was among 161 schools that attained the highest sustained rates of student academic progress over three consecutive years.

Notable Initiatives:

Backpack Program for At-Risk Population, (2010-2015). Pilot school for Care and Share Food Bank of Southwestern Colorado grant aimed at fighting hunger in the region by sending food-filled backpacks home with needy students each weekend.

1,200 sq. ft. Learning Garden and 22' Geodesic Dome Greenhouse. (2009-2015). Interdisciplinary, cross-curricular, ecology project that provides engaging, hands-on learning where students utilize nature as an outdoor classroom.
