Reminder About April 6 Deadline for Scholarship Applicants**

Florida high school graduates, G.E.D. recipients have a few final days to apply

TALLAHASSEE, FL – April 4, 2012 – The Florida Association of Postsecondary Schools and Colleges (FAPSC) has issued a reminder that only a few days remain for applicants to qualify for the April 6 deadline for scholarships totaling more than \$1 million.

“Any high school graduates and G.E.D. recipients interested should make sure to submit their application for these opportunities provided by our member schools from around the state,” said Wanda Minick, FAPSC deputy director.

Submitted via computer or postmarked by April 6, graduating high school seniors and G.E.D. recipients interested need to complete applications, essays and transcripts. Interested applicants should visit www.FAPSC.org or www.FLCareers.org to fill the online application, consult a list of participating institutions to contact directly, or email scholarship@FAPSC.org or download and mail the information.

For more than 30-year years, these scholarships have played a pivotal role in higher education for Florida career college students, Minick added noting that the past few years the total funds available have surpassed \$1 million.

Ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 to full tuition, the scholarships can be used for programs from short-term diplomas to four-year college degrees in a variety of fields of study including: computer information technology, cosmetology, criminal justice, culinary arts and healthcare.
