Mitchell R. Heppenheimer elected vice president of Indiana State Bar Association

INDIANAPOLIS (Oct. 15, 2014) – Mitchell R. Heppenheimer, South Bend, was elected as vice president of the Indiana State Bar Association (ISBA) for 2014-15 at the Association’s annual meeting in Indianapolis on Friday, Oct. 10. His term will expire in October 2015, after which he will become president-elect and then president of the ISBA. As president, he will represent the single largest legal organization in the state.

Heppenheimer is the managing partner at the firm Heppenheimer & Korpala and has been the deputy county attorney for St. Joseph County since 1981. He is a member of the St. Joseph County (current treasurer; past president; member, board of directors), Indiana State (past chair, House of Delegates; past treasurer, member, Board of Governors; past member, Membership & Membership Benefits Committee; past chair, Unauthorized Practice of Law Committee; past chair, BARPAC Committee) and American bar associations. Heppenheimer is also a Fellow of the Indiana Bar Foundation. He received his B.S. in accounting from Indiana University Bloomington in 1972 and his J.D. from the Cumberland School of Law, Samford University, Birmingham, Ala., in 1976.
