

**2002 ITAA Fellow – Kim K.P. Johnson**



Kim K.P. Johnson has been honored as ITAA Fellow at the New York City Annual Meeting. Kim is a Professor and Director of Graduate Studies in the Department of Design, Housing, and Apparel in the College of Human Ecology at the University of Minnesota. Prior to this appointment she was a faculty member at the University of North Texas and Arizona State University. Her doctorate and master's degrees were awarded from the University of Wisconsin-Madison; the bachelor's degree was granted from the University of Wisconsin at Stevens Point.

As editor of the *Clothing and Textiles Research Journal*, Kim has brought credibility, consistency, and an effective manuscript management process to the journal. Colleagues credit Kim with a philosophy of inclusiveness that benefits scholars and educators in clothing and textiles.

Johnson established herself as a noteworthy researcher particularly in areas that address social responsibility and make an impact in improving individuals' lives. Her area of expertise has focused on appearance in the context of sexual harassment and date rape. Colleagues have noted that Kim's research offers a foundation to a serious issues. Her scholastic efforts have resulted in 38 refereed articles, three book chapters, and three books. Her command of the textile and apparel subject matter has been demonstrated through her successful teaching efforts and collaborative efforts with colleagues. Dr. Johnson has been described as a person with vision; an educator and researcher who mentors others. Congratulations, Kim, on being honored as a prestigious ITAA Fellow.
