What is Training in Systematic Instruction (TSI)?

Training in Systematic Instruction offers structured one-to-one support to prepare an individual with learning disabilities to acquire the skills they need for the job. Activities are generally task-based and in a real environment. This allows individuals to effectively learn procedures associated with employment including job-related routines and accommodations to the workplace culture.

Two day course

- Suitable for:** Anyone wanting to support people with learning disabilities into work and when they are in work
- Group size:** 12 participants per workshop
- Length:** Two full days

Course content overview

This course teaches delegates how to effectively prepare individuals with learning disabilities with the skills and confidence they need for work. It is delivered over two days through a series of presentations, group discussions and practical exercises in a safe and open environment.

It provides an in-depth and practical understanding of:

- ⦿ Analysis of jobs and task preparation
- ⦿ Planning and practical application of training strategies
- ⦿ Monitoring and recording achievements.

Aims of the course

- ⦿ Introducing trainers to the principles of TSI
- ⦿ Applying TSI in supported employment and community-based activities for people with learning disabilities
- ⦿ Providing the opportunity to practise systematic instruction in a 'safe' teaching environment
- ⦿ Identifying and discussing different approaches to training, learning and their role as trainer
- ⦿ Presenting an open forum for discussion.
