HAPPY ANNIVERSARY CUMBERLAND PLATEAU REGIONAL WASTE MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

Twenty years ago the cost of operating and maintaining landfills was becoming a great financial burden for the four counties in the Cumberland Plateau Planning District. With the passage of the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the counties were given a once in a lifetime opportunity to get out of the landfill business and mitigate their closure and long-term reporting costs by joining a regional authority. The Cumberland Plateau led an effort to take advantage of this opportunity. Three of the counties chose to go this route and formed the Cumberland Plateau Regional Waste Management Authority. They received grant funding to help build modern transfer stations and transfer their waste to a state-of-the-art landfill in East Tennessee. The Authority contracts with the PDC to administer the program.

Over the past 20 years, millions of dollars have been saved by the 3 counties. In addition, due to impressive recycling and litter prevention programs, the three counties recently reported a 42.5 percent recycling rate.
