



**Poster Session: SoTL research by philosophy teachers and independent research by undergraduates in philosophy**

**Call for proposals  
Deadline: September 15, 2017**

The American Association of Philosophy Teachers (AAPT) and the APA Committee on the Teaching of Philosophy invite proposals for a poster session at the Eastern Division Meeting of the American Philosophical Association in Savannah, Georgia, January 3-6, 2018.

This session is part of the Teaching Hub organized by the AAPT and the APA Committee on the Teaching of Philosophy. The Teaching Hub is a collaborative meeting space that hosts a series of informative programs about the teaching of philosophy at divisional meetings of the APA. (In 2018 there will be a Teaching Hub at the Eastern and Pacific Division meetings.)

We invite proposals for one of two different kinds of posters that will be featured at the session:

1. Posters by undergraduate students featuring the topic of an honors thesis, summer research project, or other independent research project
2. Posters by faculty or graduate students on research on the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL)

Please be aware that in order to participate in this session, membership in the American Philosophical Association is required, and registration for the APA Eastern Division meeting may also be required. Please see the following web pages for more information:
