ORDER

By order dated March 29, 2017, this Court opened a 90-day public comment period on the Application of the American Board of Trial Advocates (ABOTA), Montana Chapter, seeking to amend the written and oral oaths of attorneys upon admission to the Bar of the State of Montana. The amendment would include a pledge to “maintain civility toward opposing parties and their counsel not only in court, but also in all written and oral communications.” No one submitted comment during the time allowed.

Having considered the Application, the Court determines that it is well taken. The Court appreciates the efforts of ABOTA, through its *Civility Matters* program, to elevate the standards of integrity, honor, ethics, civility, and courtesy in the legal profession and to promote professional and civil behavior in the practice of law, among both lawyers and judges.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that, effective immediately, the written and oral oaths of admission to the Bar of the State of Montana are amended in the form attached to this Order.




