PlayPrints are ground markings of colorful shapes, images and games painted on open pavement. Research shows that children who visit playgrounds with markings take part in a greater amount of physical activity during recess than children at unmarked playgrounds[i].

The colorful and creative designs are eye catching and allow children to play standard games or create their own" stated NCRPA Executive Director Michelle Wells

PlayPrints is part of BCBSNC's Get Outside North Carolina! (GO NC!) program. GO NC! helps North Carolinians build healthy and active lifestyles through the advancement of greenway systems, increased access to public bicycles and the overall promotion of outdoor physical activity.
