PAINT STEWARDSHIP LAWS

Since 2009, eight states and D.C. have passed paint stewardship legislation.

COLLECTION SITES

PaintCare has added:

- **132** retail sites in OR, for a total of **148** PaintCare-contracted collection locations
- **568** retail sites in CA, for a total of **712** PaintCare-contracted collection locations
- **108** retail sites in CT, for a total of **141** PaintCare-contracted collection locations
- **26** retail sites in RI, for a total of **28** PaintCare-contracted collection locations
- **31** retail sites in VT, for a total of **71** PaintCare-contracted collection locations
- **170** retail sites in MN

CONSUMER CONVENIENCE

On account of measures to increase convenience,

- **96%** of Oregon residents,
- **97.8%** of California residents, and
- **99.9%** of Connecticut residents

now live within 15 miles of a paint collection site.

PAINT COLLECTION & RECYCLING

State	Total Paint Collected in Last Reported Year	Increase from Pre-Program Baseline	Latex paint-to-paint recycling rate
Oregon	621,173 gallons	37%	63%
California	2,050,122 gallons	Unknown	71%
Connecticut	240,798 gallons	78%	81%

Since paint stewardship legislation was first implemented in Oregon, the paint stewardship program has collected a total of approximately eight million gallons of paint.

TRANSPORTATION AND PROCESSING COST SAVINGS

PaintCare covers transportation and processing costs for all contracted collection sites.

This translates to direct cost savings for local governments that would otherwise pay for full paint management costs.
