What is product stewardship?


Product stewardship is a policy that minimizes the impact of products and packaging on health, the environment, and society, while maximizing economic benefits, throughout all lifecycle stages. The product manufacturer has the greatest ability to minimize adverse impacts and maximize benefits, but all stakeholders play a role.

What is a PSC?

Product Stewardship Councils (PSCs) are statewide groups of local governments, and sometimes state government agencies, businesses, organizations, and others, that move product stewardship programs and policies forward at a grassroots level.
