Each year, SIM Memphis selects headwind and tailwind topics that IT executives face on a short and long term basis.

The annual SIM International trends survey, similar surveys from Gartner, Forrester, CIO Magazine, Forbes and others, as well as most major conference agendas, focuses squarely on providing each chapter with information that is used to steer the yearly meeting topics.

Whether this is Mobile, Cloud, Social, IT consumerization, or topics like Big Data, the programs are designed to provide you with relevant information to be more strategic in your leadership and decision making.

Our programs committee works diligently to plan sessions that will provide a return on your time invested.

Strategy Series for Executives

In addition to the monthly programs, each year since 1988 we have held a half or full day event designed exclusively for CEOs, CFOs, COOs, CIOs and other key leaders from the Memphis Mid-South area. The event format combines keynotes, panels, and participant dialog with the opportunity to network with business counterparts. The event brings national and international thought leaders to Memphis to explore ideas and opportunities with respect to the top business and IT issues of the day. Past speakers have included Rob Carter, Warren McFarland, Joel Barker, Michael Hammer, Jim Wetherbee, Jerry Luftman, and a long list of local and national business and IT executives.

Proceeds from the Strategy Series enable us to fund our many Outreach Programs which are aimed at furthering the pursuit of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) careers in the youth of the community.

Community Outreach

Future Potential for IT / STEM (Science Technology Engineering)

Inspired by a passion for Information Technology (IT), the Society for Information Management (SIM) Memphis Chapter strives to promote the IT profession through various outreach initiatives which provide educational opportunities for young people. The Chapter pursues outreach programs which involve not only financial support, but also encourage partnerships with strong local institutions and significant SIM member engagement.

Encouraging the Pursuit of Technology-Related Degrees and Careers

Teen Tech Camp

Since 2005, SIM Memphis has partnered with the Memphis Public Library to produce a week-long summer technology camp for 12-15 year olds. Students interested in attending the camp submit an application along with a recommendation from a teacher. Because of SIM funding, selected attendees pay nothing to attend. During the camp, students do hands-on computer programming to create a video game or music video. They are given freedom to express their own artistic creativity in designing and programming their individual projects which incorporate photos, video, and music. Additionally, SIM provides speakers during the week to demonstrate a new or interesting technology. The camp provides an opportunity for these young teenagers to gain valuable insight into careers in technology in a fun and engaging way. It generates excitement about future possibilities, and has inspired some to consider IT as a career path.



Technology Career Day

Each year SIM Memphis produces *Technology Career Day* at the University of Memphis. The 2-3 hour event consists of speaker presentations and panel discussions which explore a wide range of IT jobs, hiring and career trends, and tips from employers and recruiters. Speakers are IT executives in a variety of organizations and industries. SIM members are on hand to meet with students and answer questions. *IT Career Day* was started in 2008.



IT Women -- Role Models for Girls' Schools

In 1985 37% of computing degrees were awarded to women; in 2009 that number was 18%. Women hold 56% of professional jobs in the US, but only 25% of IT jobs. Because girls at all-girl schools have, on average, higher math and science test scores than girls at co-ed schools, SIM Memphis has chosen to take IT women to three local girls' high schools to encourage more young women to pursue technology-related degrees and careers by raising their awareness and understanding of the industry. We believe it will be a Win-Win for both the IT industry and the young women.

Scholarships

SIM Memphis has funded endowments in Management Information and Computer Science at the collegiate level.

Membership Qualifications

To qualify for SIM International membership, you must belong to one of these four leadership categories (Please note: SIM Chapters may have additional membership requirements. For more information, visit chapters.simnet.org).

Practitioner

A senior-level IT professional at either a public or private sector organization who meets the following criteria:

- Head of a corporate or divisional information technology organization
- Member of a technology management staff supporting corporate/divisional heads with key IT management roles, as certified by the head of the organization

Academician

A full-time university or college faculty member, making a significant contribution to the information technology field.

Consultant

Leader at the partner/principal level, in a **non-sales role**, who influences the technology of his/her own company or his/her clients' companies and who directly contributes to the information technology profession.

Thought Leader

A non-IT executive such as a leader from another profession who has a major role in matters impacting the strategic direction of his or her organization and its utilization of information technology.

Dues Categories

Qualified IT professionals can join either as individuals or through one of SIM's group memberships:

- **Corporate Individual/Enterprise:** Individual memberships are available for qualified persons. Enterprise packages offer individual memberships, program participation, and/or event registrations for qualified employees from the same company.
- **Not for profit/Academic/Government:** Individual memberships are available for qualified persons. Packages offer individual memberships, event registrations, and/or *MIS Quarterly* subscriptions for academicians within the same academic unit (department, college, etc.)
